^{*} These double letters are the same. The second letter is used in place of the first letter when it occurs as the last letter in a word.

^{**} Those who are familiar with New Testament Greek may be surprised to see the addition of the letters vau (number value = 6) and koppa (number value = 90). The letter vau appears in Revelation 13:18 as the numerical value of the number 6 in the number 666. In the early history of the Greek language both these letters existed, but later became extinct. They have always retained their numerical equivalency (see Webster's Dictionary).
