Natural History

- Does the Creation Chronicle (Genesis 1:1-2:3) contain a clear cosmology?
- How can biblical chronology, which indicates that Universe began less than 6,000 years ago, and current cosmology, which indicates that (a) Universe began 13.8 billion years ago and (b) the earth was formed 4.5 billion years ago, be reconciled?
- Does the Bible refer to catastrophes in addition to the Flood?
- Can the series of catastrophes in the Bible explain the stratigraphy in the Geologic Column, to which uniformitarian geologists assign time periods that stretch over the entire age of the earth?

Human History

- What were the Ages of the Ancients?
- Were the Ancients' Ages the product of catastrophes that are described in the Bible?
- If the Ancients' Primordial Age equals the Edenic Era (3977 BC), what happened in it and how did it end?
- If the Ancients' Golden Age equals the Antediluvian Era (3977-2321 BC), what happened in it and how did it end?
- If the Ancients' Silver Age equals the Postdiluvian Era–Part 1 (2321-1870 BC), what happened in it and how did it end?
- If the Ancient's Bronze Age equals the Postdiluvian Age–Part 2 (1870-1464 BC), what happened in it and how did it end?
- Is there a period missing between the Ancients' Bronze Age and the Ancients' Heroic or Mycenaean Age – I call it the Ancients' Missing Age?

- Does the period which I call the *Turbulent Era* (1464-665 BC) divide nicely into three sub-eras: (a) the Ancients' Missing Age (1464-1008 BC), (b) the Ancients' Heroic Age (1008-754 BC), and (c) the Ancients' Iron Age, (754-665 BC)?
- What happened in the Ancients' Missing Age, which I call the *Reign of Venus*, how did it end, and why was it missed?
- What happened in the Ancients' Heroic Age, which I call *War in the Sky*, how did it end, and why are the accounts of Greek, Trojan, and Roman exploits¹ in it dismissed as myth?
- What happened in the Ancients' Iron Age, which I call the *Reign of Mars*, and how did it end?
- Can the *Turbulent Era* be identified with the Pleistocene Epoch of the geologists?
- What happened in the Early Historic Period (665-2 BC), which in the Middle East was divided into (a) the Babylonian Period (665-487 BC), (b) the Persian Period (487-330 BC), (c) the Macedonian Period (330-146 BC), and (d) the Roman Period (146-2 BC)?
- What happened in the beginning of the Late Historic Period (2 BC-the present)?

God's Chosen People

- Who were the ancient Hebrews?
- Did God choose the Hebrews to be his "chosen people" and "the apple of his eye" (Zechariah 2:8) and why?
- What religions have the Hebrews practiced?
- What land did God give them and for how long did he give it to them?
- What different modes of rule have they lived under - e.g. tribe, kingdom, satrapy, ghettos in foreign cities, closed settlements in foreign lands, a sovereign state, etc.?
- With whom did God make the New Covenant?
- Did Christians replace the Jewish people as the Israel of the Bible (a doctrine called supersessionism or replacement theology)?
- Does the State of Israel present a challenge to followers of Yeshua of Nazareth?

God's Institutions

- What does God have to say about the individual?
- What does God have to say about the family?
- What does God have to say about the church?
- What does God have to say about the state?

¹ Some of these exploits were (a) the Slaying of the Minotaur c. 850 BC, (b) the Voyage of the Argo c. 845 BC, (c) the 1st Theban War c. 832 BC, which was conducted by the Greek Seven against Egyptian Thebes, (d) the 2nd Theban War c. 820 BC, which was conducted by the Greek Epigoni against Egyptian Thebes, (e) the Trojan War c. 812-802 BC, (f) the Odyssey c. 800-790 BC, (g) the Aeneid, which started with the fall of Troy c. 802 BC and ended with the occupancy of Rome by the Trojans c. 792-789 BC, (h) the 1st Olympic Games, which probably started in 777 BC, the 25th anniversary of the Greek victory at Troy, and (i) the conquest of Rome by Romulus and Remus in 754 BC.
