- Comments:**
- 1 Palm Sunday would have occurred 3 days before Passover instead of the traditional five days.
 - 2 The women would have had all day Nisan 16 to buy spices after the Feast Day (Mk 16:1, here Nisan 15) and before the normal Sabbath (Lk 23:56, here Nisan 17).
 - 3 Exactly 72 hours would have transpired from Jesus' burial at the end of Passover (Nisan 14) to His resurrection at the end of the Sabbath (Nisan 17) - in conformance with Matthew 12:40.
