- Comments:**
- 1 Five days before Passover would have been Sunday - the traditional date for the Procession with Palms.
 - 2 Since both the Annual Feast Day (Mk 16:1) and the normal Sabbath (Lk 23:56) fell on Nisan 15, the women would have had all day Nisan 16 or Nisan 17 to buy spices.
 - 3 Exactly 72 hours would have transpired from Jesus' burial at the end of Passover (Nisan 14) to His resurrection at the end of the normal day (Nisan 17) - in conformance with Matthew 12:40.
