⁸ Geometry is the study of the measurement, properties, and relationships of points, lines, and angles in various dimensions. It includes (a) plane geometry, which deals with a two-Dimensional surface and the shapes which can be formed within it (e.g. circle, triangle, rectangle, rhombus, etc.), (b) solid geometry, which deals with three-Dimensional space and the shapes that can be formed within it (e.g. sphere, tetrahedron, cube, octahedron, dodecahedron, icosahedron, etc.), and (c) analytic geometry, which deals with defining both straight and curved lines and surfaces (e.g. line, vector, parabola, cone, etc.) with algebraic equations that utilize points located within a coordinate system whose axes (e.g. x, y, and z in a three dimensions of space and sometimes a fourth dimension of time) are divided into regular units.

¹³ Kabbalistic Judaism dispensed with blood sacrifice as atonement for sin, replaced prophet, priest, and king with mystical adepts, and replaced the Bible with esoteric texts.

¹⁴ Roman Catholicism replaced the one-Time, all-Sufficient sacrifice of Christ on the cross at Calvary with a continual sacrifice of an ersatz christ on the altars of the Catholic Church, replaced prophet, priest, and king with the Pope, replaced the Bible with papal pronouncements and a catechism that is based on those pronouncements, and repressed the Jewish character of Christianity.

¹⁵ Islam replaced the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob with the god of Mohammed, whose name is Allah and whose reign is expanded by infiltration, deception, and the sword.

¹⁶ Sunni is a denomination of Islam and contains 87-90% of all Muslims. Sunni Muslims revere the Prophet Muhammad and his teachings (the sunnah). They are considered orthodox. Sunnis include Wahhabis = Salafis, who represent about 3.5% of Sunni Muslims. They are considered ultra-Orthodox and puritanical. About 85-90% of them live in Saudi Arabia. ISIS is a jihadist subdivision of Wahhabism = Salafism.

¹⁷ Shi'a is a denomination of Islam that contains 10-13% of all Muslims. They revere their ayatollas and their ayatollas' teachings. They are considered unorthodox and even heretical. Shi'as include Ithna Asharis (Twelvers) (85%), Ismailis, Zaydis, Alevi, and Alawites. 70-80% of Shi'a Muslims live in Iran, Iraq, Pakistan, and India.
