# Some Important Words Annotated

In my writing, there are certain names and nouns which I treat with great care and gravitas and to which I give precise, but perhaps unfamiliar definitions, such as *God*, *LORD*, *Satan*, *Mankind*, *sinners*, *the Lost. saints, the Redeemed, Universe, Earth, Creation*, and *the supernatural and the natural*.

#### God

The Bible affirms that God exists and identifies him as the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God is the simple name for the Godhead, which consists of three, unique persons: (1) God-the-Father, who is the designer and author of Creation; (2) God-the Son, who is the Maker, Sustainer, Manager, Redeemer, and Judge of Creation and always acts in conformity with the Father's will; and (3) God-the Holy Spirit, who is the energizer and animator of Creation and always acts in conformity with the will of the Father and the Son. The Godhead is often called the "Trinity." <sup>1</sup>

## LORD

God-the-Son is the second person of the Godhead., He is identified (a) in the Tenakh or Old Testament as YHWY (Jehovah in English) or Angel of the Lord and (b) in the New Covenant Scriptures or New Testament as Yeshua (Jesus in English), who is the Jewish Messiah (Christ in English), meaning the Anointed One. Consider some of the things that the Scriptures say about Him:

- God identifies Him as "...my beloved Son"<sup>2</sup> in whom he is "sell pleased."<sup>3</sup>
- God has chosen Him to be "...the one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus" (1 Timothy 2:5).
- God requires all men to recognize Him as "...the blessed and only sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone has immortality,..."<sup>4</sup>
- God requires all men to humble themselves and bow before Him, because He, "... though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, made himself nothing taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men: And being found in human form, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to the point of

It is both a unity and a trinity in that its single form depends on the presence of its three different and distinct components; it disappears if one of these components is removed. As Buckminster has demonstrated in his book <u>Synergetics</u>, it is the basic form in Universe's simplest and most stable building-block, the tetrahedron, which consists of four, triangular sides. Interestingly, in the Bible, the number one symbolizes the Godhead, the number three symbolizes the Trinity, and the number four symbolizes Creation. Also interestingly, Einstein demonstrated that Universe must be as a four-dimensional continuum in which its three spatial components and one temporal component cannot be reified.

death, even death on a cross. Therefore God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."<sup>5</sup>

Also worth noting is that God must have revealed the God-the-Son's presence and position in the Old Testament period, because men called on the name of the Lord as early as Enos's time  $(3355-2990 \text{ BC})^6$  and then many times thereafter.<sup>7</sup>

#### Satan

The Bible indicates that Satan exists and that he is the greatest, most beautiful, most intelligent, most powerful, and most wise of God's created beings.<sup>8</sup> Although (a) he led a rebellion against God of one third of the angels in Heaven,<sup>9</sup> (b) he was defeated and cast out of heaven, after which he and his followers have been called "demons," and (c) he will soon be cast into the Lake of Fire,<sup>10</sup> even the archangels show respect for him. When Michael and Satan were engaged in a dispute over the body of Moses, Michael avoided confronting Satan directly by saying, "May the Lord rebuke you."<sup>11</sup> While Christians know that Satan has been defeated, we must still grant him a measure of respect, for he is far more formidable than we realize.

#### Mankind

The Bible indicates that God created Universe and Earth as a home for Mankind, whom he created (a) in his own image<sup>12</sup> and (b) "male and female" <sup>13</sup> (only two genders exist) to exercise dominion (stewardship) over Earth's other creatures.<sup>14</sup>

#### Sinners

The Bible indicates that, excepting only Adam, Eve, and Jesus of Nazareth, every living person in the past, present, or future, is a sinner. Adam and Eve were created sinless, but then they sinned when they ate of the fruit of the Tree of Life at the center of the Garden of Eden.<sup>15</sup> As a result of Adam's disobedience, all their descendants were or will be born sinners. Jesus was born

sinless, lived a sinless life, and died on the cross at Golgotha as a perfect sacrifice to atone for the sins of Mankind.

### The Lost

The Bible indicates that the Lost are sinners who have not yet accepted Jesus of Nazareth, Israel's Messiah, as their Lord and Savior, whether out of ignorance or willfulness.

## Saints or the Redeemed

The Bible indicates that saints, who are also called the Redeemed, are sinners who have repented of their sins and accepted Jesus of Nazareth, Israel's Messiah, as their Lord and Savior. Their names were written in the *Book of Life* by God-the-Father before God-the-Son laid the foundations of Universe,<sup>16</sup> and they become found by God when they are *born again* of God-the-Holy Spirit.<sup>17</sup> Thus they cannot claim any merit or credit for their blessed state, but can only live a life of humble gratitude in service to their Lord.

### Earth

It is odd that we give names to the other planets like Mercury, Venus, Mars, Saturn, Jupiter, Uranus, Neptune, and - dare I add – Pluto, but we refer to the terrestrial globe on which we live as "the earth" – i.e. just so much dirt – as if its unique ability to sustain life is not worth noting. In recognition of the foregoing, I will usually refer to the third planet of our solar system as Earth - *capitalized*. Earth is a part of Universe.

## Creation

It is one thing to talk about the human creation of an artifact – e.g. a clay bowl, an oil painting, or a space-travelling rocket. It is another to talk about the divine creation of all things or everything. In this instance, I do not think it is any more appropriate to use "the creation" than to use "the everything." God's handiwork deserves the name Creation - *capitalized* – which is the way I will use it.

At first glance, Universe and Creation may seem to refer to the same entity. In fact, they do not. Universe refers to what we can experience or postulate about our environment, but it is confined to interstellar space and the objects which it contains – e.g. stars, planets, moons, asteroids, comets, etc. Creation, on the other hand, can refer to Universe, but it can also refer to everything which God has created outside Universe, about which we know extraordinarily little. Thus, we need to be very precise about boundaries.

The Bible indicates, I believe, that Creation consists of concentric, spatial spheres arranged as follows: (1) **Earth<sup>18</sup>** at Creation's center,<sup>19</sup> (2) the 1<sup>st</sup> Heaven<sup>20</sup> above Earth, which is also called the firmament or interstellar space, (3) the **Upper Waters**<sup>21</sup> above the 1<sup>st</sup> heaven, (4) the 2<sup>nd</sup> **Heaven**<sup>22</sup> above the Upper Waters, and (5) the 3<sup>rd</sup> Heaven, <sup>23</sup> which lies outside Universe. Thus, in the Biblical view of Creation, there is a physical boundary between any two of the spheres, of which the outermost boundary lies between Universe and the 3<sup>rd</sup> Heaven.

The Bible also implies, I believe, that reality consists of several ontological orders.<sup>24</sup> Based on my reading of Genesis, I postulate three domains, each consisting of a number of realms, as follows: (A) the ELEMENTAL DOMAIN consisting of (1) the Primordial Realm, (2) the Possible Realm, and (3) the Probable Realm; (B) the NATURAL DOMAIN consisting of (4a) the Mineral Realm, (4b) the Plant Realm, (4c) the Animal Realm, and (4d) the Human Realm, and (C) the SUPERNATURAL DOMAIN consisting of (5) the Celestial Realm and (6) the Divine Realm. Once again, there is an ontological boundary between any two of the realms, of which the last boundary lies between the Celestial Realm and the Divine Realm - i.e. the boundary between the created realms and the divine realm.

#### Israel

It is divided into five main layers by temperature: (a) the troposphere (0-7 miles), (b) the stratosphere (7-31 miles), (c) the mesosphere (31-50 miles), the thermosphere (50-440 miles), and (d) the exosphere (440-6,200 miles).

Scott's <u>The Electric Sky</u> (2006), I believe that its contents by mass are (a) primarily electromagnetic plasma (est. 96%) and (b) secondarily astronomical bodies (est. 4%), such as stars, planets, moons, asteroids, and comets which occur within astronomical objects such as galaxies, nebulae, star clusters, and planetary systems - starting with the earth's sun and moon. Its extent is unknown.

Few people pay any attention to it anymore because humanistic science has succeeded in persuading so many people that only natural factors exist in Universe, and that supernatural factors exist solely in the minds of naive, superstitious, primitive minds.

The Bible indicates that God chose the descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, who are called the Hebrews, the Jews, or Israel, to be "the apple of his eye,"<sup>25</sup> "to be a peculiar people unto himself above all the nations that are upon the earth."<sup>26</sup> It also indicates that God said to them, "...ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should show forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvelous light."<sup>27</sup> It indicates that God established ten covenants: three universal covenants with mankind in general<sup>28</sup> and seven restricted covenants with Israel in particular.<sup>29</sup> Finally, it indicates that the New Covenant with the Jews is also open to gentiles who accept the Jewish Messiah as their Lord and Savior.<sup>30</sup> Thus, there is an *Israel of the Flesh*, which consists of the Jews (both new covenant-keepers and new covenant-breakers) and an *Israel of the Spirit*, which consists of believing Jews (new covenant-keepers).

# The supernatural and the natural

The spatial spheres and ontological realms cannot simply be identified with *outside* and the *inside* of Universe. The Bible indicates the following: (a) God is a spirit and immanent or omnipresent in Creation, both outside and inside Universe; (b) angels and demons are spirits and can be found everywhere in Creation, both outside and inside Universe; and (c) humans possess a spiritual or supernatural component, but are located in Universe during this life and either in Heaven or Hell in the afterlife.
