## THE BIBLE'S USE OF NUMBERS

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## Preamble

The Bible contains hidden characteristics which tell us much about what the text overtly describes. One of these hidden characteristics involves numbers, the study of which is called Gematria by the rabbis and early Christians, Numerics by Ivan Panin and his followers, and Theomatics by Del Washburn and his followers.

Because both Hebrew and Greek lack numerals, they use letters of the alphabet to represent numerical values. For example, 1 is represented by aleph in Hebrew and alpha in Greek; 2 is represented by beth in Hebrew and beta in Greek; 3 is represented by gimel in Hebrew and gamma in Greek; 4 is represented by daleth in Hebrew and delta in Greek; 5 is represented by he in Hebrew and epsilon in Greek; etc.

Because every letter possesses a numerical value, every word, phrase, sentence, paragraph, chapter, and book also possesses a numerical value. Moreover, students of this phenomenon quickly discover that each number bears a meaning. For example, 1 stands for unity or God; 2 stands for division; 3 stands for the Godhead or the Trinity, which consists of three distinct persons, God-the-Father, God-the-Son, and God-the-Holy Spirit; 4 stands for creation (the Godhead plus something else which is not God); 5 stands for the grace of God; 6 stands for fallen Mankind or imperfection; 7 stands for spiritual perfection, completeness, fullness, and rest; 8 stands for new beginnings, new life, renewal, regeneration, rebirth, and resurrection; 9 stands for completeness, conclusion, finality, judgement; 10 stands for divine order, ordinal perfection, especially with respect to authority, law, responsibility, or testimony; 11 stands for disorder, disintegration, disorganization, and imperfection; and 12 stands for divine government, governmental perfection, and the chosen; etc. Thus, for example, the fact that the Bible gives us seven views of the Throne Room of God communicates spiritual perfection to us.

## Section 1 - The Meaning of Numerical Values

1. UNITY, primacy, God, beginning-1st prime number.
2. SEPARATION, division, difference; also God-the-Son; also enmity, opposition; also $2=1+1$ (something versus its opposite); also 2nd prime number.
3. DIVINE PERFECTION, the Godhead, the Trinity; also God-the-Holy Spirit; also completeness, entirety, solidity (cube), reality (time $=$ past, present, \& future; space = height, width, \& depth; matter = mineral, vegetable, \& animal); also resurrection; also $3=1+1+1$ (Father, Son, \& Holy Spirit); also 3rd prime number.
4. CREATION, material completeness; also mankind as creature; also $4=3+1$ (God plus something outside of God).
5. GRACE; also redeemed man called out from mankind; also $5=4+1$ (mankind as creature plus something added from God); also $4^{\text {th }}$ prime number.
6. FALLEN MANKIND; also imperfection; also human labor; also $6=4+2$ (mankind as creature plus enmity against God) or $5+1$ (grace plus something added by man that renders grace of no effect) or $7-1$ (something less than spiritual perfection).
7. SPIRITUAL PERFECTION, completeness, fullness, and rest; also $\boldsymbol{5}^{\text {th }}$ prime number. Examples:

- In the Bible: seven occurs $287(=7 \times 41)$ times, seventh occurs $98(=7 \times 14)$ times, and seven-fold occurs 7 times; $287+98+7=392=7^{2}+7^{3}=7^{2} \times 8$; seventy occurs $56(7 \times 8)$ times.
- God created the heavens and the earth in 7 days, and then rested on the $7^{\text {th }}$ day, the Sabbath (Genesis 2:2).
- Enoch, who walked with God, was the $7^{\text {th }}$ patriarch (Genesis 5).
- The $7^{\text {th }}$ mention of Noah in the Bible records that he was perfect in his generations (Genesis 6:9).
- God instructed Noah to board the clean beasts by 7s (Genesis 7:2).
- The flood started 7 days after Noah entered the ark (Genesis 7:9-10).
- God gave a 7 -fold blessing to Abraham (Genesis 12:2-3).
- God promised the land of Canaan to Israel 7 times (Genesis 12:7, 13:14-17, 15:7, 15:18-21, 17:8, 26:3, and 28:13).
- Pharaoh dreamed of 7 fat years and 7 leans years (Genesis 41 ).
- God gave a 7-fold promise to the nation of Israel (Exodus 6:6-8).
- The consecration of Aaron and his sons lasted 7 days (Leviticus 8:31-36).
- On the Day of Atonement, blood was sprinkled on th mercy seat 7 times (Leviticus 16:14).
- God instructed Israel to observe 7 feast days (Leviticus 23:1-44). ${ }^{1}$
- Israel's Jubilee Year followed 7 sabbaths of years (7x7=49) (Leviticus 25:8).
- On the $7^{\text {th }}$ day of the battle for Jericho, the Israelites led by 7 priest bearing 7 trumpets marched around the city 7 times (Joshua 6).
- The construction of the temple took 7 years (1 Kings 6:38).
- Naaman washed 7 times in the Jordan River, and he was cured of his leprosy (2 Kings 5:10 and 14).
- In the Book of Revelation, there the following sevens: 7 churches (1:4); 7 spirits of God (1:4 and 3:1); 7 candlesticks (1:12 and 1:20); 7 stars (1:16 and 1:20); 7 promises to overcomers (2-3); 7 commendations to the church at Ephesus (2:2-3); 7 horns and 7 eyes (5:6); 7 seals (6); 7 trumpets (8-9); 7 thunders (10:3-4); 7 angels with 7 plagues (15:7); 7 vials (16); and 7 new things (2:17, 3:12, 5:9, 14:3, 21:1, 21:2, 21:5)

8. NEW BEGINNINGS, $1^{\text {st }}$ of a new series, new life, renewal, regeneration, rebirth, new creation, resurrection; also superabundance; also $8=7+1$. Example:

- Numeric value of Jesus is 888 .

9. COMPLETENESS, conclusion, end, finality, judgement; also $9=3 \times 3$. Examples:

- Jesus' six hours on the cross ended at the $9^{\text {th }}$ hour (Luke 23:44).
- The Holy Spirit gives 9 spiritual gifts to Jesus' disciples ${ }^{2}$.

10. DIVINE ORDER, ordinal perfection, especially with respect to authority, law, responsibility, or testimony; also complete cycle. Examples:

- Genesis contains a series of cycles: the cycle of creation is defined by 10 occurrences of the phrase "and God said ${ }^{3}$;" the cycle of corruption is defined by the lives of the first ten patriarchs ${ }^{4}$; and the cycle of promise is defined by the lives of the next ten patriarchs ${ }^{5}$.
- God requires a tenth of our increase (responsibility).
- God afflicted Egypt with 10 plagues (testimony to God's power) ${ }^{6}$.
- God gave Moses 10 commandments (authority \& law).

[^0]11a. $1^{\text {st }}$ meaning - DISORDER, division, disintegration, disorganization, and imperfection; also $11=10($ divine order $)+1($ something added $)=12($ divine government) - 1 (something subtracted); Examples:

- There were 11 dukes of Edom, an enemy of Israel (Genesis 36:40-43).
- After Joseph's older brothers disposed of him, only 11 sons of Jacob remained (Genesis 37:31-35).
- The trip from Horeb, "the mountain of God" (Exodus 3:1) at the northern border of the promised land, to Kadesh Barnea, a settlement at the southern border of the promised land where Israel balked (rebelled) at entering the promised land, took 11 days (Deuteronomy 1:2).
- The lords of the Philistines paid Delilah 1,100 pieces of silver to deceive Samson (Judges 16:5).
- Micah stole and then returned 1,100 shekels of silver belonging to his mother, and she used a portion of them to create a graven image for Micah's house (Judges 17:1-3).
- Jehoiakim, the wicked king of Judah, and Zedekiah, the rebellious king of Judah, each reigned 11 years (2 Kings 23:36 and 2 Chronicles 36:11-12).
- Jesus lived 33 years ( $3 \times 11$ ) and then was "cut off" (Daniel 9:26).
- After Judas Iscariot committed suicide, the apostles numbered 11(Acts 1:26) and immediately felt the need to restore the number to 12 , which the 120 disciples did by appointing Matthias (Acts 1:15-26).

11b. $2^{\text {nd }}$ meaning - JUDGEMENT. Examples:

- The cursed Canaan (Genesis 9:25) had 11 sons (Genesis 10:15-18). ${ }^{7}$
- The destruction of Pharaoh and his armies in the waters of the Red Sea was the $11^{\text {th }}$ plague to fall on Egypt.

12. DIVINE GOVERNMENT, governmental perfection, the chosen; also $12=3 \times 4$, or the heavenly number times the earthly number. Examples:

- There were 12 patriarchs born after the Flood. ${ }^{8}$
- There were 12 sons of Jacob. ${ }^{9}$
- There were 12 tribes of Israel ${ }^{10}$ - they were positioned relative to the tabernacle as follows: 3 to the north, 3 to the east, 3 to the south, and 3 to the west - i.e. $3 \times 4-$ Levi was in the tabernacle.

[^1]- There were 12 judges of Israel $^{11}$.
- There were 12 apostles ${ }^{12}$.
- There were 120 disciples ( $12 \times 10$, or divine order times governmental perfection).
- Jesus began to "be about my father's business" (Luke 2:49) when he was 12 years old (Luke 2:42).
- Jesus could have called upon 12 legions ${ }^{13}$ of angels in the Garden of Gethsemane (Matthew 26:53).
- New Jerusalem is defined by twelves ${ }^{14}$ (Revelation 21:9-27).

13. REBELLION, apostacy, and defection; also corruption, depravity, disintegration, revolution, superstition, and fear. Examples:

- Nimrod, the founder of rebellious Babylon, was the $13^{\text {th }}$ in the line of Ham (Genesis 10:6-10).
- The four kings of the vale of Siddim ${ }^{15}$ rebelled against Chedorlaomer, king of Elam in the $13^{\text {th }}$ year (Genesis 14:4).
- The often disobedient nation of Israel was split into 13 tribes when the tribe of Joseph was split into the tribes of Ephrain and Manasseh. ${ }^{16}$
- Of the 21 sins listed against Israel in the wilderness, the $13^{\text {th }}$ sin was when Israel rebelled and refused to enter into the promised land (Numbers 14:6-9).
- On the $13^{\text {th }}$ day of the first month, Haman decreed death to the Jews on the $13^{\text {th }}$ day of the twelfth month (Esther 3:8-13).
- Jesus listed 13 characteristics ${ }^{17}$ of the rebellious heart (Mark 7:21-22).
- The Dragon (Satan) is mentioned 13 times in the Book of Revelation (12:3, 12:4, 12:7 twice, $12: 9,12: 13,12: 16,12: 17,13: 2,13: 4,13: 11,16: 13$, and 20:2).
- The men of Sodom were identified as "wicked sinners before the Lord" in the $13^{\text {th }}$ verse of the $13^{\text {th }}$ chapter of Genesis.

[^2]14. DELIVERANCE, salvation; also $14=2$ (God-the-Son) $\times 7$ (spiritual perfection). Examples:

- Israel was delivered from bondage on the $14^{\text {th }}$ day of the month (Exodus 12:67).
- There were three sets of 14 generations from Abraham to Messiah (Matthew 1:7).
- Paul journeyed to Jerusalem 14 years after his conversion (Acts 15:1-2 and Galatians 1:1-2).
- Paul encouraged his shipmates on the $14^{\text {th }}$ day of the month, and all were saved (Acts 27:33-44).


## 15. SPIRITUAL REST

- $15=7$ (God rested) +8 (new birth)
- Three times a year Israel rested on the $15^{\text {th }}$ day (Leviticus 23:6-7, Leviticus 23:34-35, Esther 9:20-22).
- The $15^{\text {th }}$ time Naomi is mentioned (Ruth 3:1), she seeks rest for Ruth through Boaz, her kinsman redeemer.
- The term "kinsman" occurs 15 times in the Book of Ruth.
